It is government policy in Ontario that health care providers working at Ontario clinical sites **refrain from going to work** should they present symptoms that may be attributable to a person-to-person transmittable acute infection, which includes any of the symptoms listed above.

While the risk of COVID-19 in healthcare workers with recent travel to affected areas is very low, it is important that all countries take a precautionary approach to this serious virus. As such, it is imperative that learners monitor themselves for symptoms, and report any such symptoms immediately.

If you develop symptoms of an acute respiratory infection within 14 days of arriving or returning to Canada:

- **Stay home.** Do not present for school, your clinical site or work.
