Ontario Genomics has announced that the new round 26 of Genome Canada's Genomic Applications Partnership Program (GAPP) is now open for applications.

The GAPP funds public-private research collaborations focused on validating genomics-derived technologies that address real-world opportunities and challenges identified by industry, government, not-for-profits, or other "Receptors" of genomics knowledge and tools across all sectors. The program provides a unique opportunity for Receptor organizations to collaborate with an academic 'omics researcher, and to leverage their research and development (R&D) investments with public funding.

Key Program Highlights:

- **Budget:** \$300K \$6M (total)
- **Co-funding:** 1/3 Genome Canada (max), 1/3 Receptor (min), up to 1/3 other, as applicable; can be cash, in-kind, or a mix of both
- Award duration: 2 3 years
- Stage: Downstream R&D/validation/pilot
- Funding recipient: Genome Canada funds flow to academic* partner only

Potential applicants are encouraged to do this well ahead of the draft intake date. Project teams that are a potential fit will be provided the Expression of Interest (EOI) form. **Draft EOIs are due to Ontario**Genomics on April 4, 2023, at 9am. Please refer to the Ontario
